Submission of Papers and Commentaries and Access:

Please save your papers and commentaries in Rich Text Format (rtf). To save as rich text, select the "save as" option in your word processor, and choose "rich text document" from the "file type" drop-down menu. The title will have an .rtf suffix.

Then, send the paper as an attachment to Bruce.Landesman@mail.hum.utah.edu. There may later be an additional address to which papers can be sent.

I will send you a reply, letting you know I have received the paper. Please contact me if you do not receive a relatively quick reply.

After I have received your paper, it will go through a process so that it can appear on the web page.

To access papers on the page, go to the web site and then to the 2006 conference page. Click on "Members can view submitted papers here". You will be asked for a User name and Password. Here they are:

Length Guidelines:

As a guideline, principal papers should be no longer than 5000 words (about 20 pages) and commentaries no longer than 2500 words (about ten pages). There is no penalty for shorter papers and commentaries.

Membership:

As I hope you recall, the officers and Executive Committee believe it is important that AMINTAPHIL attract a new generation of political and legal theorists to our organization. In previous newsletters, we have called on you to encourage your younger colleagues in appropriate fields to join AMINTAPHIL.
