**2006 CONFERENCE, NOVEMBER 2 – 5, WASHINGTON
UNIVERSITY, ST. LOUIS MISSOURI**

TOPIC: COERCION, JUSTICE AND DEMOCRACY

This Newsletter contains urgent information about the November conference.

The conference hotel, **the Knight Center**, had agreed to hold a block of 60 rooms for us through Sept. 10. That time has now passed. Thirty rooms have been reserved and the remaining thirty have been released. The Knight Center, however, will make those rooms available to our members at the conference rate (\$109/night) so long as rooms are available.

If you wish to stay at the Knight Center (on the Washington University campus) and have not made a reservation, please do so as soon as possible. The local phone number is 314 933-9400; the toll free number is 866 933-9400. **When calling please inform the hotel, that you are reserving for the AMINTAPHIL conference.**

Please note that rooms at the Knight Center contain only one Queen-sized bed and they do not offer roll-away beds. Participants who would like to share with another participant (but do not want to share a bed) can reserve rooms at our back-up hotel, as follows:

The rate is \$99 per night. The Crowne Plaza is about a mile and half from campus, where the meetings will be held. The Crowne Plaza has shuttles available to transport participants from the hotel to the University and back. We will book one of the vans when we know the numbers staying at the hotel.

Note Concerning Papers on the Web Site

We have asked people to submit papers in rich text format (rtf). Submitted papers have been put on the web site in both rtf and PDF formats. I have discovered that if you open the rtf paper under the TextEdit program, you will lose the footnotes. My computer (a Mac) does open in TextEdit automatically if I click on the paper.

But I can open it in Word, with the footnotes, if I first download the document, then highlight it, then go to "Open With" under Finder file menu, and open with Word.

It appears that PC's automatically give you the option of how to open it. It may, however, depend on the computer, the browser, and more.

In any case, to get the footnotes (often the most revealing part of the paper!), either open the PDF or open the rtf file as a Word Document (not a text document).

I suggest that those sending papers and commentaries from now on send me both a word document (ending in .doc) and an rtf document. That will help us make it easier for us to ensure that footnotes are included.

Possible Metrolink from the AIRPORT:

Metrolink (rail service) currently only goes from the Lambert International Airport to about ½ mile east of campus and the Knight Center. However, new construction and a new station which links Metrolink (rail service) to campus should be completed by October 2006, so in time for the conference.

If the new construction is completed on time, you should be able to take the Metrolink from the Lambert Airport Station to the Forest Park-DeBaliviere Station. Switch trains at the Forest Park-DeBaliviere Station to a train that goes to the University City – Big Bend Station (next to the Danforth campus). The train that goes to the University City – Big Bend Station should be a train heading towards Shrewsbury.

Alternatively, you can currently take the Metrolink from the Lambert Airport Station to the Forest Park-DeBaliviere Station and from there take MetroBus Service (#1 Gold Service) to the Mallinckrodt Center, which is also on the Danforth campus and directly south of the Knight Center.

Due to the new construction, if you desire to use rail service, it is suggested that you check the latest updates closer to conference time to ensure that the predicted station names and routes have not changed. Taxi from the AIRPORT:

Ask the taxi driver to take you to the Charles F. Knight Center located on Throop Drive on the Washington University campus across the drive from a covered parking garage. The taxi fare is probably about \$35 from the airport.

Driving From the NORTH and From LAMBERT INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT: From I-70

- Take the exit for I-170 going south.
- Take the exit for Forest Park Parkway.
- This becomes a city street just before Big Bend Boulevard (which is the first stoplight).
- Turn right (south) onto Big Bend.
- Almost immediately, turn left (east) onto campus driveway Snow Way and continue for .2 miles.
- Turn left (north) onto campus driveway Throop Drive at the stop sign then turn right into the parking garage.
- The Charles F. Knight Center is located across from the parking garage on the south side of Throop Drive.
- Please park in the parking garage and proceed into the main entrance of the Charles F. Knight Center.
- You may buy one-day parking permits at the desk; you will need one in your car on Thursday and on Friday but not on the weekend. The cost is \$6 for a one-day pass.

Driving From the EAST: From I-64 (Hwy 40) (from downtown St. Louis)

- Take the Skinker/Clayton Road exit and turn right (north) onto Skinker Boulevard (the cross street at the end of the exit ramp).
- Travel north on Skinker Boulevard for approximately .8 of a mile.
- Turn left (west) on Forsyth.
- Continue west on Forsyth for approximately .6 of a mile.
- Turn right (north) onto Big Bend Boulevard and continue for .1 miles to campus driveway Snow Way.
- Turn right (east) onto campus driveway Snow Way and continue for .2 miles.
- Turn left (north) onto campus driveway Throop Drive at the stop sign then turn right into the parking garage.
- The Charles F. Knight Center is located across from the parking garage on the south side of Throop Drive.
- Please park in the parking garage and proceed into the main entrance of the Charles F. Knight Center.
- You may buy one-day parking permits at the desk; you will need one in your car on Thursday and on Friday but not on the weekend. The cost is \$6 for a one-day pass.

Driving From the WEST: From I-64 (Hwy 40) (from west county)

- Take Exit 33D-McCausland and turn left (north) onto McCausland Avenue.
- Continue north on McCausland Avenue (name changes to Skinker Boulevard) for approximately 1 mile to Forsyth Boulevard.
- Turn left (west) onto Forsyth.
- Continue west on Forsyth for approximately .6 of a mile.
- Turn right (north) onto Big Bend Boulevard and continue for .1 miles to campus driveway Snow Way.
- Turn right (east) onto campus driveway Snow Way and continue for .2 miles.
- Turn left (north) onto campus driveway Throop Drive at the stop sign then turn right into the parking garage.
- The Charles F. Knight Center is located across from the parking garage on the south side of Throop Drive.
- Please park in the parking garage and proceed into the main entrance of the Charles F. Knight Center.
- You may buy one-day parking permits at the desk; you will need one in your car on Thursday and on Friday but not on the weekend. The cost is \$6 for a one-day pass.

Driving From the SOUTH:

- Take I-270 west/north to I-64 (Hwy 40), and then follow the directions above for approaching from the west.

Parking Pass for the Knight Center: (the Parking Structure across from the Center)

For Thursday and Friday, you will need a parking pass from the reception desk at the Knight Center. You may obtain this upon arrival. You will not need a parking pass for Saturday or Sunday.
